Defenders of Wildlife's *2018 Conservation Report Card* measures the commitment of U.S. senators and representatives to wildlife and habitat conservation during the 2017 and 2018 sessions of the 115th Congress. It tells you at a glance if your elected representatives are preserving America's natural heritage for our children and grandchildren.

This report card reviews 12 Senate votes and 20 House votes with serious implications for wildlife, habitat and the environment, including House legislation that would have turned the Farm Bill into an attack on wildlife and bedrock environmental protections, a bill that would have required funding for a damaging border wall to keep the government open, an amendment that would have blocked Endangered Species Act protections for hundreds of threatened and endangered species, and a tax bill that authorized drilling in Arctic National Wildlife Refuge.

Two bright spots in this Congress of setbacks were votes that defeated a Senate amendment that could have led to the removal of more than 1,000 protected species from the endangered species list and a House amendment that would have blocked endangered species protections for the endangered New Mexico meadow jumping mouse.

SENATE

KEY ISSUES & VOTES

1 Revoking the Stream Protection Rule

The Senate passed a resolution to permanently revoke the stream protection rule put in place to protect the health and safety of people and the environment from the harmful effects of surface coal mining and toxic runoff in our waterways. *(February 2, 2017, Roll Call No. 43)*

2 Confirming Scott Pruitt as EPA Administrator

The Senate confirmed Oklahoma Attorney General Scott Pruitt, a climate-change denier, as the administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency. *(February 17, 2017, Roll Call No. 71)*

3 Revoking an Important Land-use Planning Rule

The Senate passed a resolution to permanently revoke the land-use planning rule for the Bureau of Land Management, which guides the use and conservation of millions of acres of federal public lands and the wildlife that depend on them. *(March 7, 2017, Roll Call No. 82)*

4 Revoking the Alaska National Wildlife Refuges Rule

The Senate passed a resolution to permanently revoke the Alaska National Wildlife Refuges rule that was intended to help conserve native carnivores—including bears, wolves and their young—on millions of acres of national wildlife refuges in Alaska. *(March 21, 2017, Roll Call No. 92)*



5 Confirming David Bernhardt as Deputy Interior Secretary

The Senate voted to confirm David Bernhardt, a former lobbyist for extractive industries and developers, as deputy secretary of the Department of the Interior. *(July 24, 2017, Roll Call No. 166)*

6 Removing Federal Endangered Species Act Protections for More Than 1,000 Species

The Senate rejected an amendment that would have removed or blocked federal Endangered Species Act protections for all intrastate species—plants and animals that exist solely within the borders of a single state—a category that includes more than 1,000 currently listed species. *(October 19, 2017, Roll Call No. 242)*

7 Sparing Arctic National Wildlife Refuge from Industrialization

The Senate rejected an amendment that would have protected Arctic National Wildlife Refuge from oil and gas drilling. *(October 19, 2017, Roll Call No. 243)*

NOTE: Legislators who served a full term received “Incomplete” scores if they missed more than 25 percent of the key votes. Legislators who served a partial term did not receive “Incomplete” scores unless they missed more than 25 percent of the key votes while they were in office.

8 Advancing Drilling in Arctic National Wildlife Refuge and Passing an Anti-Environmental Budget

The Senate passed a budget resolution that paves the way for oil and gas drilling in Arctic National Wildlife Refuge and proposes drastic cuts to discretionary spending totaling \$800 billion, which could hurt environmental programs. *(October 19, 2017, Roll Call No. 245)*

9 Authorizing Oil and Gas Drilling in Arctic National Wildlife Refuge

The Senate voted to pass the tax bill, which authorizes an oil and gas drilling program in Arctic National Wildlife Refuge after more than three decades of fighting to protect this wildlife haven from Big Oil's advances. *(December 20, 2017, Roll Call Vote No. 323)*

10 Funding a Damaging Border Wall

The Senate rejected a motion to limit debate on an amendment that would provide \$25 billion for border security including a damaging wall that would irreversibly harm sensitive lands and imperiled wildlife along hundreds of miles of the southwest border and address various immigration issues. *(February 15, 2018, Roll Call No. 35)*



11 Funding a Damaging Border Wall and Waiving Rule of Law

The Senate rejected a motion to limit debate on an amendment that would provide \$25 billion for border security including a damaging wall that would irreversibly harm sensitive lands and imperiled wildlife along the southwest border, waive 36 environmental and cultural laws for construction of the wall and other border enforcement activities on federal lands within 100 miles of both the northern and southern borders, and address various immigration issues. (*February 15, 2018, Roll Call No. 36*)

12 Cancelling Funding for Crucial Conservation Programs

The Senate rejected a motion to advance a bill rescinding funding for several important programs, including ones that support sustainable use of agricultural lands and protection of national forest lands. (*June 20, 2018, Roll Call No. 134*)

1 Revoking the Stream Protection Rule

The House passed a resolution to permanently revoke the stream protection rule that protects people and the environment from the harmful effects of surface coal mining and toxic runoff in our waterways. *(February 1, 2017, Roll Call No. 73)*

2 Revoking an Important Land-use Planning Rule

The House passed a resolution to permanently revoke the planning rule that guides the Bureau of Land Management in the use and conservation of millions of acres of federal public lands and the wildlife that depend on them. *(February 7, 2017, Roll Call No. 83)*

3 Revoking the Alaska National Wildlife Refuges Rule

The House passed a resolution to permanently revoke the Alaska national wildlife refuges rule that helps conserve native carnivores—including bears, wolves and their young—on the millions of acres of national refuge lands in the state. *(February 16, 2017, Roll Call No. 98)*

4 Stripping Protections for California's Fish, Wildlife and Rivers

The House passed a bill that would severely weaken and override Endangered Species Act protections for salmon and other endangered fish in California's Bay-Delta estuary, threaten vital deliveries to wildlife refuges, effectively repeal the San Joaquin River Restoration Program, preempt state conservation laws, and weaken permitting requirements for new dams in the western United States. *(July 12, 2017, Roll Call No. 352)*



5 Authorizing a Land Transfer for a Road Through Izembek National Wildlife Refuge

The House passed a bill that would authorize a land exchange between the federal government and Alaska to build a road through a wilderness area in Izembek National Wildlife Refuge, damaging world-class wildlife habitat and undermining fundamental environmental laws. *(July 20, 2017, Roll Call No. 406)*

6 Stealthily Funding a Damaging Border Wall

The House passed a massive funding bill that includes \$1.6 billion to pay for a 70-mile expansion of President Donald Trump's proposed wall along the U.S.-Mexico border, a partition that would slice through a national wildlife refuge and other sensitive wildlife habitat. *(July 27, 2017, Roll Call No. 435)*

7 Revoking the Predator Rule in Alaska's National Preserves

The House passed an amendment that would prohibit conservation protections for wolves, bears and other large carnivores on national preserves, which are managed by the National Park Service in Alaska. *(September 7, 2017, Roll Call No. 478)*

8 Advancing Drilling in Arctic National Wildlife Refuge and Passing an Anti-Environmental Budget

The House approved the Senate's budget resolution, which paves the way for oil and gas drilling in Arctic National Wildlife Refuge and proposes a drastic \$800-billion reduction in discretionary spending that could hurt environmental programs. (*October 26, 2017, Roll Call No. 589*)

9 Stripping National Forest Safeguards to Promote Reckless Logging

The House passed a bill that would eliminate several important environmental safeguards for logging projects on national forests, including review of the impacts of projects—some as large as 47 square miles—on communities, wildlife and the environment; endangered species consultation; public participation in decision-making; and legal review. (*November 1, 2017, Roll Call No. 598*)

10 Authorizing Oil and Gas Drilling in Arctic National Wildlife Refuge

The House voted to pass the tax bill, which authorizes an oil and gas drilling program in Arctic National Wildlife Refuge after more than three decades of fighting to protect this wildlife haven from Big Oil. (*December 19, 2017, Roll Call No. 692*)



11 Undermining Protections for Imperiled Salmon and Endangered Orcas

The House passed a bill that would override a federal court decision, accept an inadequate Biological Opinion that fails to protect imperiled salmon and trout on the Columbia and Snake Rivers and salmon-dependent endangered southern resident orcas, and prohibit relevant agencies from studying measures to help Columbia River basin salmon. (*April 25, 2018, Roll Call No. 153*)

12 Weakening Environmental and Judicial Review of Logging on National Forests

The House passed an amendment that would prohibit the Forest Service from considering reasonable alternatives to logging projects and undermine judicial review of unlawful logging projects. (*May 17, 2018, Roll Call No. 198*)

13 Exempting Alaska's National Forests from the Roadless Rule

The House passed an amendment that would exempt national forest lands in Alaska, including Tongass National Forest, from the Roadless Area Conservation Rule. (*May 17, 2018, Roll Call No. 199*)

14 Turning the Farm Bill into an Attack on Wildlife and Bedrock Protections

The House passed a Farm Bill that included attacks on Endangered Species Act consultations for potentially lethal pesticides, sweeping and dangerous rollbacks of national forest protections and cuts to conservation programs. (*June 21, 2018, Roll Call No. 284*)

The House passed an amendment that would devastate conservation and recovery efforts for species listed as threatened and endangered under the Endangered Species Act by blocking federal funding for all species for which the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service has not completed a formal five-year status review. *(July 18, 2018, Roll Call No. 350)*

16 Blocking Endangered Species Act Protections for the New Mexico Meadow Jumping Mouse

The House rejected an amendment that would block funding for the endangered New Mexico meadow jumping mouse under the Endangered Species Act and eliminate crucial recovery programs for the mouse that require federal funding. *(July 18, 2018, Roll Call No. 353)*

17 Blocking Endangered Species Act Protections for the Lesser Prairie-Chicken

The House passed an amendment that would prevent the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service from spending funds to list the lesser prairie-chicken under the Endangered Species Act. *(July 18, 2018, Roll Call No. 354)*



18 Attacking Wildlife Through Funding Cuts and Riders

The House passed a FY 2019 Interior appropriations bill that cuts funding for wildlife and habitat and includes more than a dozen riders undermining the Endangered Species Act. *(July 19, 2018, Roll Call No. 365)*

19 Delisting Gray Wolves in the Lower 48 States

The House passed a bill that would delist the gray wolf, removing Endangered Species Act protections for it in the contiguous 48 states. *(November 16, 2018, Roll Call No. 420)*

20 Requiring Funding for a Damaging Border Wall to Keep the Government Open

The House passed a bill with temporary funding to prevent a partial government shutdown that also included \$5.7 billion for a damaging wall that would irreversibly harm sensitive lands and imperiled wildlife along the southwest border. *(December 20, 2018, Roll Call No. 472)*
